NATIONAL WOMENS EXPO – 14TH – 16TH JUNE, 2017

The 2017 National Women's Expo marked another historical milestone in Fiji's efforts to recognize Fijian Women towards the National Holistic Development which boosted our women's level of confidence in believing themselves and transforming their challenges into opportunities..

This was held at the Vodafone Arena from 14th- 16th June, 2017 that was officially opened by H.E. President, Major Jioji Konrote who addressed the enormous crowd, stating these words of encouragement -

"The National Event is instrumental in generating innovative entrepreneurial ideas and approaches to strengthen the participants businesses". The Fijian Government through the Ministry of Women, Children and Poverty Alleviation together with development partners, continue to recognize and nature the talents and potentials of our women- especially as the custodians of the beautiful handicrafts and products that are elegantly displayed this morning" end of quote.

A National event which was attended by women from all over Fiji including Rotuma to come together and showcase the different Fijian Handicrafts that they are renowned representing the fifteen (15) provinces in Fiji, whether the products were traditionally or contemporarily produced

The event has been staged by the Ministry of Women, Poverty Alleviation for the third year since 2014 focusing on the recognition of rural women artisans in their creativity and further connecting them to markets both local and overseas markets.

This year's theme "<u>Be Empowered Be the Change</u>" was words of encouragement in recognizing and reaffirming women's capacity as *agents of change* in whatever entrepreneurial ideas and approaches to strengthen them in their business developments

The Fiji Arts Council has been very grateful with the ongoing collaboration with the Ministry of Women for the past three years and being given the recognition and acknowledgement to assist the Ministry to assess in the various Divisional Craft Shows that were held as an ongoing preparation towards the 2017 Fiji National Women's Expo in June.

1.0 Roles of Fiji Arts Council – Pre and During the Expo

The Fiji Arts Council was tasked to oversee these roles during the major event

a) Being given the major role in recommending and nominating those eligible to be awarded the *Fijian Crafted Licenses* based on Criteria's to showcase quality, distinctiveness and authenticity of Fijian Crafted for women that represented the Eastern Division, consisting Kadavu, Lau and the Lomaiviti group. The three (3) Provinces were not able to come

together at one time to hold their craft shows compared to other Divisions. With the assistance of few Licensed Recipient, Fiji Arts Council were able to identify 30 additional women to be provisionally approved for Fijian Crafted License. The names of the thirty women were also announced during the presentation, pending the endorsement of the Compliance Committee in the near future.

b) Working in partnership with the Ministry of Industry Trade and Tourism in Facilitating of the **51 approved Licenses** that had met the criteria to be qualified for *Fijian Crafted Licenses* that were awarded by The Attorney General Hon. Saiyed Khaiyum in the third day of the event. (*The List of the 51 Participants is attached to this Report*)

- c) Setting up and decorating the Main Dias at Vodafone Arena and assisting MOW in the Fashion Show which was also part of the 3 days program
- d) Setting up the Fiji Arts Council Booth which was also used as information and awareness centre for all those that required our assistance

- e) Organizing the participation of the 15 Licensed Craft Artisans to participate alongside the 500 selected crafters representing the 15 Provinces including Rotuma.
- f) FAC were able to assist new applications to become members of the Fiji Craft Society and also pay their annual registration (thirty new applications were registered during the National Women's Expo) A list of new applications is tabled below

2.0 PARTICIPATION OF OUR LICENSED CRAFTERS DURING THE EXPO:

The Fiji Arts Council was given the opportunity by the Ministry of Women to engage the participation of 15 Licensed Craft Practitioners during the 3 days event with an intention to benchmark for the rural women artisans the standard of excellence that a recipient acquires to be eligible for *Fijian Crafted License*.

A project proposal in seeking funding to enable the participation of those 15 recipients was submitted to the Department of Heritage and Arts for their assistance, unfortunately this was not possible but the request was later considered by FAC for the financial assistance.

3.0 OBJECTIVES OF THEIR PARTICIPATION

- The participation of **15 Craft Practitioners, that represented Fiji Arts Council** aimed to showcase and benchmark quality standards for handicrafts, raising international awareness and promoting innovations to keep the products relevant and competitive
- Showcasing the best of their own talents and skills had encouraged those that were
 exhibiting for the first time, to see for themselves the quality and standard of work
 produced from our local raw materials using traditional skills, patterns and themes in an
 innovative way, in order to ensure the continuity and sustainability of these traditions and
 skills.
- Most women are representing their respective Provinces at the very grassroots levels, an opportunity having the village people understanding the significance of the Authentic Branding and the impacts that has brought about to those that has been licensed
- "Be Empowered Be the Change" as Theme of the Expo it focuses on women to be empowered to promote quality crafts that uphold best quality and of high standards of excellence.
- The opportunity for the Expo participants to know the significant roles that Fiji Arts Council
 plays in the development of the handicraft sector in local economic development and
 poverty eradication.
- (I was given a 15minute slot to present to the crowd the criteria used by FAC in assessing their work during their craft shows, and making them attend this National event), highlighting the processes to become members of Fiji Craft Society, FAC as being the door way to attend International events such as Festival of Pacific Arts, Melanesian Festivals, World Expos
- The 15 participants had the opportunity to meet and share their experiences with other participants.
- Giving them the opportunity to be recognized in their talents and creativity and further connecting them to the markets

5.0 <u>HIGHLIGHTS OF THE EVENTS:</u>

The women had been really challenged in the huge sales they had made in the three days of selling and all of them were so impressed in watching their counterparts who are also licensed but represented their own Provinces and part of the main National Expo group.

The Following Recipients and members of the Fiji Craft Society were awarded top prizes during the expo and this was one of the challenges witnessed by members which was an impact of those that have been recognized in the excellence that they showcased in the different products that they are renowned for. Apart from selling their products they also participated in the Fashion parade and received special awards:

- Mataiasi Qaroro the only male weaver was awarded the top prize of producing a Wedding Traditional Costume made out of Kuta – He received an electric sewing machine with cash prizes
- Manuapa was awarded the overall prize in the Wedding Attires which she sewed out of masi- She was given an electrical sewing machine and cash as her prize
- Rosalia Sui from Savusavu who is a contemporary Jeweller and Textile producer was
 presented with the Casual Wear category. She was awarded an electrical sewing machine as
 well as cash as her prize
- Maana a Rotuman Traditional weaver represented the Western Division was awarded a prize of which she had made the top sales of \$4,600- She was awarded a cash prize of \$500.00

All the above named participants are Fijian Crafted Recipients and live members of the Fiji Craft Society

6.0 MEDIA INTERVIEWS WITH CREAT ARTISAN RECIPIENTS:

Other Women artisans who are also members, were given the opportunity to share their impressive stories about their talents. This was something that all of them were proud of. It gave them the recognition of the many different talents to make their own products at the same time get a value out of their work.

The following women who are also Fijian Crafted Recipient were highlights of the Expo – their stories were highlighted in the Daily Papers – (*Copies are attached as part of this report*)

- **Maana Vamarasi** Rotuman Weaver from Nadi
- **Mikaele Sovasova** Sovanitabua Fan weaver from Natewa- he was one of the three Male participant showcasing with the women

- **Kalesi Tasere and Kelera Vakili** Potters from the village of Nayawa, Sigatoka, they are specialized in making very huge pots and yaqona Bowls "Dari"
- **Pat Fraser** represented the Busy Bees Women's Group from Lautoka alternative use of plastic wastes, wrappers to be turned into purses, baskets, etc
- **Betty Volau and Juria Henry** all the way from Rotuma to receive their Fijian Crafted Licenses
- **Amrita Devi** uses colourful crocheting threads to make dolls
- **Ann Miller** from Savusavu , weaves cushions out of pandanus leaves
- **Banaban Women** Virgin oil, traditional Mats and Fans and Baskets

7.0 CONCLUSION:

The Fiji Arts Council is the National body for the Arts, with the mandate of encouraging, promoting and supporting the arts in Fiji for the benefit of all Fijians. We are also required to advocate for and promote Fijian Crafted Products and practitioners locally, nationally and internationally.

The enormous numbers of participants attending the 3 days event was very encouraging, and to observe the many different talents and creativities of rural women with their ability to participate in sustainable economic activities as such that benefitted their individual families, loved ones, own communities and the national economy were very impressing

Recognizing the hard work that each women had presented with the amount of money they had received in selling their products, we can say that they have reaped the fruits of their tireless efforts.

I personally acknowledge the hard work of the Ministry of Women in bringing all the 500 participants to the National Expo, the financial assistance provided by Fiji Arts Council, our Team efforts in partnership with Ministry of Women in making this event a very prosperous one.
