ROKOVUAKA VILLAGE WORKSHOP

ROKOVUAKA VILLAGE WORKSHOP REPORT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This workshop is a culmination of months of preparatory work, carried out by the people of Rokovuaka Village. The main person involved and was Program Coordinator for the workshop was Mr. Timoci Matakiwiwa.

Mr. Matakiwiwa is the 'daunivucu' and leader of the Vuakaloa Meke & Cultural Group who was selected to represent Fiji at the Melanesian Arts Festival in Port Vila, Vanuatu, in August 2002. Upon his return he remained in contact with the Department and the FAC to basically pursue cultural activities to further enhance his group. He has a piece of property in Dama Village, Ra which he hopes to develop into a Cultural Center and become part of the Eco-Tourist projects which are currently being developed by the Eco-Tourism arm of the Ministry of Tourism.

Several meetings were held involving the chiefs and headmen of the surrounding villages, resulting in the formation of a conceptual 3 year plan to develop / revive cultural activities for the province of Ra. The plan was formulated to coincide with the completion of the King's Road construction which is scheduled to complete in 2005. The plan was to develop and strengthen cultural activities to a quality and professional level to truly reflect the culture of Ra. The Cultural Center is also planned to be completed at that time, which will include all the amenities to accommodate the tourists and visitors to the center.

Hence, as a first step in this direction and since meke teaching and rehearsals were well under way it was decided that other forms of cultural activities should be revived including traditional Fijian Protocol and customs by way of workshops.

A letter stating these intentions were distributed to all the village elders in the Ra Province with an invitation to participate in the said workshop.

Upon receipt of positive responses from several villages a letter outlining the proposed workshop was forwarded to the Department of Culture & Heritage requesting for financial assistance.

The proposal was forwarded to the FAC who submitted a budget for approval.

2.0 PARTICIPANTS

A total of ninety nine [99] participants from 17 villages in the Ra District participated with the largest number from Rokovuaka Village itself of 55 participants. Catering for the two week workshop was shared between the villages.

4.0 DURATION

Two weeks from 5th - 16th May, 2003.

5.0 MATERIALS

All materials used for the bure construction and carving were obtained from the forest areas surrounding Rokovuaka and Wailevu Villages. Voivoi was purchased and treated pine timber for the doors and windows of the bure.

6.0 METHODOLOGY – 2 WEEK PROGRAM

The entire workshop was programmed and coordinated by the Resources Persons listed above in concurrence with the village elders. Timoci made weekly visits to FAC updating the Secretary of the progress of how the workshop was being 'put together'.

Letters had been forwards to all village elders in the district of Ra soliciting their respective support and participation in the workshop.

After responses were received from the villages a date was set for the workshop initially for one [1] week. However, due to inclement weather and the realization that some of the raw materials required for the bure construction was much further that originally known the workshop had to extend to two [2] weeks.

This change affected the budget and expenses had to be rearranged to meet this extra week's expenses.

The Director Culture & Heritage and the FAC Secretary also made an official visit to meet the elders and Resource Persons at Rokovuaka Village to discuss the workshop in detail and to also obtain the final sanction of the elders for the workshop to proceed. It was important that the elders were in agreement for this workshop to go ahead.

Week 1

6.10 Bure construction

6.1.1 Site Preparation

The site was filled and compacted and leveled several weeks before the commencement of the workshop.

6.1.2 Raw Materials

Raw materials for the bure construction were being sought from the bush and forest close to the village. Most of the main frame and roof covering needed to be transported from several kilometers away.

6.1.3 Erection of Main Structure

The main frame up to the 'A' shaped roof was erected during the latter half of the first week.

6.20 Carving

Timber for the wood carving was being sought by the participants in the nearby bushes and forest surrounding Rokovuaka Village.

6.30 Weaving

The ladies commenced weaving lessons with coconut leaves weaving baskets [ibe], fans [iri] and hats [sals]

6.40 Fijian Customs

This activity was taken in the evenings when all participants are gathered and involved all types of customary issues are discussed at this time including grog ceremonies, general Fijian manners during functions etc

Week 2

6.50 Bure Construction

The main structure of the bure was completed in the first two days of the second week including the construction of the interior walls. In the second half of the week the 'drau' was placed and secured on the roof and outer walls.

6.5.1 Walls

- The interior walls were constructed of 'evita gasau' which are approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter bamboo type rods. These rods were secured firmly with the 'wa midri' and 'wa vau' these binders also formed patterns in the interior walls which presented a beautiful aesthetic look to the interior of the bure.

- The exterior walls were covered with 'drau' leaves and firmly secured also with 'wa midri' and 'wa vau'.

6.5.2 Roof

- The interior purlins were of bamboo placed evenly from the top ridge to the main beams. These bamboos were also firmly secured with 'wa midri' and 'wa vau'
- Over these bamboos were firmly secured drau leaves placed in layers commencing from the main beams and upwards towards the top ridge.
- The a 'sota kola balabala' was placed as the ridge and was firmly covered and secured with drau and bound down with 'wa lai'

6.60 Carving

Serious carving took place this week after the timbers had been collected in the first week.

The Resource Person who hails from Ono-i-Lau in the Lau group specializes in carving Fijian masks and clubs. The crafts he taught the participants were mainly of these types of craft.

6.70 Weaving

Voivoi was purchased and the women were taught the basic art of mat weaving. The ladies also continued to weave the other craft mentioned in week 1.

7.0 FINANCE

The budget for the project was initially calculated at \$5,000.00. However, due to inclement weather and other factors mentioned earlier in the methodology the budget stretched to \$6,000.00.

Nevertheless, it should be noted that the workshop involved 99 participants from 17 villages and the program included five distinct activities, the sum of \$6,000.00 is a rather conservative amount for such a large and diverse workshop.

The Final Statement of Accounts is annexed.

8.0 GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

- This workshop was initiated by the villagers which is a major factor. The workshop 'belonged' to them which is very important for the overall success of the workshop.
- Empowerment or the transference of organising and coordinating a workshop at the village level must have the village hierarchy involved which occurred in this case

- The Department or FAC should only play a supportive role in the revival of craft and traditional customs as these belong to the respective provinces that they are located in.
- More workshops of this nature should be encouraged from the village level through their respective Tikina Councils.

9.0 CONCLUSIONS

The workshop was very well coordinated considering that there is no telephone out in Rokovuaka Village the coordination between the FAC and the Resources Persons particularly continued throughout the workshop. This liaison ensured that everyone was catered for, tools and building materials were purchased and delivered to the site without too much delay. Despite the inclement experienced during the two weeks the participants remained resolute in their intentions to ensure that every aspect of the workshop was being covered.

Comments received from the Resource Persons indicated that the workshop was a real 'eye opener' for the elders who had taken much of their traditional values for granted and let them fade away.

The workshop also brought together many family members from the nearby villages to work together with a common purpose and objective which formed new and strengthened old bonds between the villages.

The workshop was a success in every way and is a clear indication that at the village level such projects may be undertaken if everyone worked together.
